Archival Collections

Carter H. Harrison IV Papers. Correspondence, writings, clippings, photographs, and memorabilia relating to Chicago Mayor Carter Henry Harrison IV (1860-1953), and his family, particularly his wife, Edith Ogden Harrison, and his father, Chicago Mayor Carter Henry Harrison III (1825-1893). The collection also includes memorabilia from the last day of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition at which Harrison's father spoke shortly before his assassination. https://mms.newberry.org/detail.asp?recordid=300

Henry Blake Fuller Papers, 1868-2000. Correspondence, works, and miscellaneous material relating to Henry Blake Fuller, Chicago novelist, essayist, critic, and satirist. The bulk of the collection consists of Fuller's writings, both published and manuscript, and incoming correspondence, but the collection also contains clippings of articles about the World's Columbian Exposition from a variety of sources. https://mms.newberry.org/detail.asp?recordid=168

World's Columbian Exposition, and Moses P. Handy. The Official Directory of the World's Columbian Exposition, May 1st to October 30th, 1893. A Reference Book of Exhibitors and Exhibits; of the Officers and Members of the World's Columbian Commission, the World's Columbian Exposition and the Board of Lady Managers. Chicago: Conkey, 1893. Composed using statistics gathered by the World's Columbian Exposition Board of Control, this work is heavily illustrated with photographs of members of the Fair's commissions and boards, illustrations of the buildings and grounds; and plans of each building showing the location for every exhibit. **Call # R 1832** .0065

World's Columbian Exposition. *Official Guide to the Grounds and Buildings of the World's Columbian Exposition during Construction*. Chicago: World's Columbian Exposition, Dept. of Publicity and Promotion, 1892. Contains illustrations and prose descriptions of all Exposition buildings, with measurements of the buildings and their galleries, information on architects and contractors for each building, and details of construction techniques and costs. Also includes details of admission fees, transportation to the fairgrounds, statistics on foreign and state participation in the construction, and the program for the Fair's dedication ceremonies. **Call # R 1832.0065**
